2021 Louisiana WIC Conference

Leading the Way To Better Health was our theme for the 2021 Louisiana WIC Conference that was held virtually May 25–27, 2021. Hosting the conference virtually increased accessibility for WIC clinic staff across the state to attend and allowed for virtual networking. This was the first conference since 2014, and based on conference engagement and positive survey results, Louisiana WIC Staff were craving the professional development, networking and learning opportunities that the conference provided. Over 3,200 messages were posted on the community board by conference attendees.

The conference was held each afternoon over a three-day period for fourhour time blocks, allowing WIC clinic staff to serve Louisiana WIC families in the mornings and attend the conference in the afternoons. Each day started off with a one-hour plenary session. Two of these sessions had the most views: day 1 opening session "Sense Making – The Magic Questions" was viewed live by 484 attendees and the "ABC's of Trauma-informed Care" which was viewed by 468 attendees.

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LAWIC Clinic Lagniappe – "A Little Something Extra"

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In total, 560 attendees viewed the Louisiana WIC Conference sessions live for a cumulative sum of 1,837 hours. This does not include the views that occurred after the training was made available on the conference platform for attendees.

In addition, the Louisiana WIC Conference was a platform for engagement with our partners and WIC stakeholders - 15 partner agencies had virtual booths where conference attendees could view their website and videos, and chat with their staff.


Did You Know?

LA WIC Participant Surveys

Louisiana WIC launched two new participant surveys in June 2021, a *Customer Satisfaction Survey* and *Participant Experience Survey*. Louisiana WIC participants received the Customer Satisfaction Survey, which was a short (5 question) survey, following a recent WIC clinic visit. The Participant Experience Survey was disseminated to all participants that picked up benefits in April and/or May. The Participant Experience Survey provided an opportunity for participants to share more in-depth feedback on their overall experience of being a WIC participant in Louisiana. Surveys were sent through SMS or email, depending on the participant's preferred method of contact.

Breastfeeding Gold Stars

WIC BREASTFEEDING SUPPORT LEARN TOGETHER. GROW TOGETHER.

Breastfeeding support for our WIC moms comes in many forms. State Agency would like to give a "Big Thanks!" to the following **Gold Star** clinics for their willingness to quickly accommodate our NICU WIC moms. These clinics expedite Certification/Recertification appointments with hospital grade pump issuance for our NICU moms. Additionally, when these clinics receive Medical Necessity Forms from the hospital they are responsive and communicate with State Agency that mom was accommodated and issued a pump. Long delays in initiating effective milk expression put the mother at an increased risk for low milk production, resulting in mom not being able to provide adequate nutrition to her compromised infant. The importance of breastmilk at this time is so critical and these Liquid Gold Star Clinics and Staff support our NICU babies.

Participant Contact Information in LAWIN

During clinic appointments, please remember to verify participant contact information, and make any necessary updates. Also, ensure to select their preferred method of contact – *SMS (text), Email* or *Phone* that is located under the Contact Preference section (see below).

WIC staff should collect email addresses for all families unless a participant indicates they do not wish to share their email address. If email is selected as the preferred contact but the email address is blank, participants aren't able receive email communication. Likewise, if SMS (text) is the preferred message, please collect a cell phone number. If a landline number is provided, SMS (text) will not be applicable.

Regularly checking the participant contact information will ensure that WIC families receive important messages, including appointment reminders and updates about program services.

Packing Slips for Exempt Formula

Beginning in October 2020 for all WIC exempt formula orders, Louisiana WIC Contract Agencies/Sites must submit exempt formula proof of purchase documentation – packing slips – to the State Agency within *three business days* of formula shipment receipt. Please follow these steps when submitting your formula packing slips.

Step 1: Verify shipment matches information on the packing slip.

Step 2: Email a copy of the packing slip to <u>LAWICFinance@la.gov</u> and cc <u>Celia.Bridgeforth@la.gov</u>. In the subject line include the complete contract agency name, site name, formula company name and invoice number.

Example:

Access Health Louisiana, St. Tammany Community Health Center, Abbott, Invoice# 033333

If formula received is damaged or items are missing, please be sure to file claim with vendor company within 1-2 business days to receive replacement product or a credit. Be sure to cc LAWICFinance@la.gov and Celia.Bridgeforth@la.gov on the email. Use same subject line format as requested above in order for State Agency staff to associate it with the appropriate invoice order. Building Healthy Families

The Commodity Supplemental Food Program

The Louisiana Commodity Supplemental Food Program (LA CSFP) is part of the Louisiana Department of Health's Bureau of Nutrition Services. The LA CSFP program works to improve Louisiana's health outcomes by offering free and nutritious USDA commodity foods to eligible seniors who are at least 60 years of age. LA CSFP is administered on the local level by Catholic Charities Food for Seniors. Currently, the Catholic Charities Food for Seniors monthly caseload is approximately 51,098.

LA WIC clinic staff connect families to health and social programs they may qualify for. CSFP can be a useful tool in combating senior food insecurity and may offer additional supplemental nutritional services to WIC participant households that include eligible seniors.

Seniors who purchase and prepare meals separately would only include their gross income and not the income of all members of the household to determine eligibility. Seniors may not be aware that they may participate in CSFP even if they currently receive benefits from SNAP, Food Banks, the Seniors' Farmers Market or all three programs.
